ASH WEDNESDAY & LENT

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent, a 40-day period of fasting, prayer, and reflection, designed to deepen one's connection with God. The ashes that we receive upon our foreheads are there to remind us of our humble origin and our need for repentance. The ashes also remind us of Adam being formed out of the dust of the earth, and to dust we shall return when we face our physical death. Lent, being 40 days long, represents the temptation and fasting that Jesus faced in the wilderness for 40 days. Lent is a time of repentance, a time of giving something up for the betterment of our relationship with God, and for gaining a strong gratitude for Jesus' sacrifice and resurrection. Ash Wednesday and Lent are about turning back to God and understanding that sin will always separate us from Him. Use this time for self-reflection, to rid yourself of any distractions, and to draw near to God in preparation for Easter.

PASTOR'S PEACE

Scripture of the Month

Galatians 6:14

“But God forbid that I should boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world.”

Devotional from Pastor Troy

This month's Scripture comes from St. Paul's letter written to the churches that lived in Galatia. The main reason for writing this letter was to reiterate that our salvation is by grace through faith and not by our own works. It's not that Paul is arguing that our works are not important. In fact, when making the same argument in Ephesians 2:8-10, he ends by telling us that we were created in Christ Jesus for good works and that we should walk in them. What Paul is saying in this letter is that the good works we do are not what save us. This is why Paul ends this letter by saying But God forbid that I should boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ. He is declaring that the only boast for his salvation and redemption is the finished work of Christ on the cross, not his own efforts in following the works of the law. I believe this is important for us to understand as we get ready to enter the season of Lent. During Lent, we fast, repent, and redirect our actions and hearts back towards the Father. This season can be so fruitful in our walk when taken seriously. However, there is also the danger of thinking that because we are taking these steps in drawing near the Father, we are gaining our entrance into the kingdom through these actions. Let this never be our mindset. We fast, repent, and redirect our actions out of gratitude for what He has already done, and a desire walk more genuinely with our God. We all fall short of the glory and tend to allow idols to creep back into our lives. Lent is the time of year when we reflect on what needs to change and then make those corrections through prayer, fasting, and alms giving. This is what it means to say that the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world. Because of the finished work of Christ on the cross, the things of this world no longer have dominion over us.
